

Do you have any resolutions or changes in habit you hope to live into in this new year? If so, let me know. We can cheer each other on--and hold each other accountable. --Kerry



As she searches for regular employment, **Sheeba is providing alterations and engaging in other sewing projects** (contact her between 4-8 pm weekdays or 8 am-12 pm on Saturday). **Sheeba needs rides** to and from the Eurma Hayes Center on Monday and Wednesday afternoons between 1-3 pm. She and other English language learners in our community could also use rides to and from a new English Language class at John A. Carbondale Area Interfaith Refugee Support (CAIRS) has formally incorporated and applied for 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. Cindy Buys and Pat Manfredi were both elected officers of CAIRS, which anticipates settling 2-3 more Afghan families in the Carbondale area over the next several months. The Mission Ministry recently voted to donate the local portion of the Peace & Global Witness PCUSA Special Offering (\$1,335) to CAIRS in support of its ongoing refugee resettlement efforts.



The December 2024 Free Laundry Day served 37 guests--a slightly smaller crowd than usual. - We opened the December 2024 meeting of the session with prayer and a short devotional reading.
- I reported that as new terms were being negotiated for next year, Carlyn Zimmermann chose not to renew her contract as Music Director. The session voted to honor Carlyn during December 22, 2024 worship and asked me as Head of Staff to lead the process of searching for and hiring a new Music Director.



- Contributions and 2025 pledge giving were less than hoped for (primarily due to decreased membership), so the session revisited previous budget discussions and cut projected 2025 expenses by \$15,118.00.
 2025 Budget information will be available for the congregation to review and discuss at the Annual Congregational Meeting following worship on January 26, 2025.
- The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has been elected, the Nominating Committee will be searching for Elders and Deacons to begin serving in 2025, a Christmas bonus was approved for the Preschool staff, and regular business (minutes, team reports) was attended to. We closed in prayer. —Kerry



Do you usually make a New Year's resolution? Do you keep it? The **Green Guardians** encourage you to plan for your impact on the environment in 2025 by considering this information from "52 Ways to Care for Creation" at Creation Justice Ministries (creationjustice.org):

- For the new year, make a green resolution to make eco-conscious choices. Celebrate Martin Luther King Jr. Day in Carbondale to reflect on social justice and creation justice. Do a book study by yourself or with a group on an eco topic.
- Rethink your habits around plastics (re-usable water bottles, for example) and water use. Recycle flexible plastics as illustrated on the Green Guardians bulletin board.
- Repetition turns a new practice into a habit. Work with a friend from church, or elsewhere, or a family member to think it out. Pass your ideas down to your kids and grandkids.
- The **Climatehero** carbon footprint calculator at **https://carbon-calculator.climatehero.org** is easy to read on screen and considers electricity usage, transportation, and shopping habits. Check to see if you are a Climate Friend or Climate Hero (ask Ann Warner if you have questions).

The first wedding held in the new church in 1908, was that of Edith Entsminger to Everett V. Miller.

On May 31, 1909, Miss Helen Peters was granted \$200 per year as choir director. Edwin P. Purdy directed the choir following Miss Peters. Mrs. Arthur G. Purdy was organist for a while and her husband, Dr. Purdy, sometimes would play the trombone. Other organists who served the church at various times were George Brush, Dora Brubaker, amd Margaret Fox Clemens.
