Coming April 28, 2024 to the First Presbyterian Church sanctuary is the first (and no doubt last) performance of the radio-style production of **Intrepid Inspector Iona of Interpol and the Brief Case of the Missing Briefcase**.

You'll be able to watch the production live and in person in the sanctuary, or on Zoom. Immediately afterwards, we'll enjoy desserts and beverages in the Fellowship Hall. The show will go "on air" at 6:00 p.m. and we should be done and munching on delectable desserts no later than 7:15 p.m. (That's why it's a "brief" case, don't you know.) Thanks as usual to the Mission Ministry for supporting all this serious silliness.

Holy Week observations conclude with our **Easter Sunday** celebration March 31, 2024 at 9:30 a.m..



Demand for Free Laundry Day remains strong: Last month, volunteers served 55 guests and spent \$540.00 in quarters. We approved replacement of the broken HVAC unit servicing the Preschool area of the building (there are 3-4 units with faulty heart exchangers that will also need to be replaced).

We received an update from the Nominating Committee.

I shared an update on the process of addressing several Daycare program issues including small enrollment and staff size. This was further discussed with the congregation at the January 28, 2024 Annual Meeting.

We agreed—with sadness—to Bob Luebbers' request for a transfer in membership to the Eastern Orthodox church in Royalton.

We added additional signatories to the church and daycare checking accounts.

We approved the Statistical Report that goes to the Presbytery and on to General Assembly. Ministry reports, minutes and financial reports were approved, and the session also granted my request for about 12 days of vacation in late-January and early February. (I'll be back in the office February 12, 2024.)

We closed with prayer. ~ Kerry



The first sermon at the First Presbyterian Church of Carbondale was delivered in 1852 in an unfinished log cabin. By 1856, with the help of Daniel Brush, one of the founders of Carbondale, the church had found a new home at what is now 210 West Monroe.
